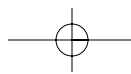
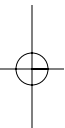

T*he prevalence of COPD is rising, both in the western countries, and more rapidly in the rest of the world. COPD is the fourth most common cause of death in the US and the only major cause of death that continues to rise, while deaths from other causes (heart disease, cancer, strokes) are decreasing. Deaths from COPD have risen 14% in men and 185% in women between 1984 and 2000. In 2000 there were more women than men dying from COPD. In addition, COPD remains an under diagnosed disease. Education is needed to increase physician awareness of the diagnosis and treatment of COPD.*

CONFERENCE GOAL:

This conference is designed to provide increased awareness of COPD and new ways to diagnose and treat this disease.
